

Technical Director Board Report Submitted by: Cadfan Edwards

CanSkate

The 2016/17 budget approval was to continue an ongoing program of CanSkate Club visits. Initially both Skate Canada AND Skate Canada Manitoba were working on similar initiatives to do CanSkate Club Visits independently, however, we were able to work together to ensure that we selected different clubs and cover more Manitoba clubs in the process. The goal of Skate Canada was not to visit every club in the province. The goal was to reach out to a select number of clubs to get a consensus on if the new program was being delivered to standard. As a section, we have made it a goal to get all our clubs "attended to" either with an in person visit, or a conference call visit.

One club was visited this fiscal year, attended by the Clinician, the Technical Director and the Coaches Representative. One of the main goals of the visit was to assess the program, and ascertain if the delivery of the program could be accomplished through teleconferencing or video without diminishing the value to the club.

The experience gained from an in-person visit to a club truly in need of assistance is invaluable, and our clinicians do an amazing job working with the clubs. To be fiscally responsible, and reach the goal of seeing every club in an appropriate time frame, a new proposal was put forward in the 2017/18 budget.

The new proposal suggests that the initial point of contact with a club is through either a teleconference, or through a video submission prosses. If it is decided through that process that the club needs additional help in delivery standards, then an in-person visit will be arranged. Using this framework, Skate Canada Manitoba will have an ability to impact 20+ clubs in one fiscal year within the same budget constraints.

Due to only one site visit being performed in the current fiscal year, the remainder of the budget through discussions with the Executive Director will be re-directed to purchase all the equipment required to complete the club visits. *Note: with each visit the clubs receive a bag filled with program delivery materials that will act as teaching aids in the program.

STARSkate

All STAR seminars were held in all regions in October and November. All but one post-event reports, budgets and pictures have been submitted. The numbers reflect all numbers except one region.

Total Participants (Skaters) – 134

Total Clubs Represented – 28

Total Coaches Attended – 18

With all seminars running within 5% of their projected budgets, and with such a large impact to Skaters, Coaches, and Clubs, this will be a core an ongoing initiative in future years.

Male Development

A meeting was held on November 30th to discuss the Male Development Program moving forward. In the past year, the Male Development Program was structed around having mentors visit boys at their clubs 1 on 1. There was a proposed seminar to follow at the end of the season, however it never materialized. It was a consensus amongst the committee that the purpose of the Male Development Program was not to

give technical feedback to the skaters, but to retain Males within our sport. As such a new proposal for use of the 2016/17 budget was submitted.

In the 2016/17 fiscal year, males from Manitoba traveled to Saskatchewan for their Black Boots Seminar. There were 10 boys in total that travelled to this seminar, as well as the Technical Director. Skate Canada Manitoba covered the registration for the 10 attendees at this event. In addition to the Black Boots Seminar in Saskatchewan, Manitoba held a short half day Seminar with Clinician Tyler Bidnyk.

In the 2017/18 fiscal year, the committee has proposed a budget for 1 Manitoba Seminar. In discussions with Saskatchewan, there will be an opportunity for boys from both provinces to attend the Saskatchewan Black Boots, as well as the Manitoba All Boys. The seminars held this year had a great sense of comradery between the boys, and exactly what we are look for to keep their interest.

Competitive

This year Manitoba had a team of 9 skaters qualifying for the Skate Canada Challenge Event (see Executive Director Report for results). In preparation for Challenge, a Challenge Prep Seminar was organized. This was a new initiative proposed for the 2016/17 fiscal year. In past years' feedback from officials was given to skaters moving forward the next day following Sectionals. In the Challenge Prep Seminar, officials sitting on panel at Sectionals were invited to evaluate in a Simulation environment. The half day seminar was well received, and a great opportunity for the officials to further explain on calls that were awarded, and work closely with skaters and coaches on how to improve on things moving forward.

Following the Skate Canada Challenge Event Skate Canada Manitoba, as well as Skate Canada Saskatchewan and Skate Canada Alberta were approached by Skate Canada to hold a National Performance Center Training Seminar. There was an open discussion between Skate Canada, and the Technical Directors of each province on the area of focus. It was decided through post event reports from Challenge that the area of focus most in need was in GOE's and PC's.

Skate Canada in conjunction with Skate Canada Manitoba and Skate Canada Saskatchewan held the NPC West Seminar in Virden Manitoba on March 24th to 26th. This was an invite only seminar directed to Coaches and Skaters. We proudly welcomed Shae Zukiwsky. Shae is an International Level Official, a former International Level Skater, and has choreographed international medalist's programs. The seminar was a massive success, and plans are under way with Skate Canada for next year's seminar. Please see the Competitive Committee Report for more information on programs that will be continuing under that portfolio.

 Skate Canada has developed an excellent NPC site which provides free video tutorials to coaches on a variety of skills, this site along with the eLearning site provides a large selection of education for our coaching community At this time, we did not feel that creating Master Class opportunities would benefit the Section Coaches as we believe that coaches should seek out the information provided by Skate Canada prior to us creating additional resources in house

Some have corporate policies regarding sponsorship that targets groups with different mandates than Skate Canada Manitoba. Ivivva has indicated strong interest in having skaters on MB teams become part of the "Ivivva Girl Crew". The number of skaters is limited and details will be worked out when the new team structure is released and the number of skaters on each team (Elite, High Performance, Development teams) is known. This does not generate money for Skate Canada Manitoba but it provides benefits directly to the skaters in terms of discounts and other opportunities.

Shaw Direct contacted Skate Canada Manitoba office regarding a possible partnership, focused on rural constituency base. Shaw Direct may be interested in a combined in kind and financial program (bursaries/grants etc.), likely first on a 1 year trial. Their goal is to increase customers through partnering with Skate Manitoba. At this point, information about Skate Canada Manitoba events has been provided to Shaw Direct and we are waiting to hear back from the Shaw Direct Marketing Department to see if this will be pursued further.

Victoria Inn Hotel & Convention Centre – The committee has completed a renewal for another 5-year partnership from January 2017 – January 2022.

- 1. A proposed 16/17 CanSkate visit list was compiled by the CanSkate Committee with feedback from Regional directors and submitted to Skate Canada Manitoba.
 - 15 CanSkate kits from Quality Classrooms were to be ordered.
 - 1 visit was completed to the club most in need as identified by the committee. The visit was assessed by the Technical Director, and Coaches Rep to see viability of program running from primarily phone call and skype.
 - The additional funds approved for the fiscal year will be allocated to purchase CanSkate Kits for all remaining clubs. (with discussion and approval from Executive Director)
 - Initially both Skate Canada AND Skate Canada Manitoba were working on similar initiatives to do
 CanSkate Club Visits independently, however, we were able to work together to ensure that we
 selected different clubs and cover more Manitoba clubs in the process. The goal of Skate Canada
 was not to visit every club in the province. The goal was to reach out to a select number of clubs to
 get a consensus on if the new program was being delivered to standard. As a section, we have
 made it a goal to get all our clubs "attended to" either with an in person visit, or a conference call
 visit.
- 2. To be fiscally responsible, and reach the goal of seeing every club in an appropriate time frame, it is proposed that initial contacts with every club be through either a teleconference, or video stream. If it is decided through that process that they need additional help in delivery standards, at that time an inperson visit with one of our clinicians will be arranged. The Technical Director has budgeted for 20 conference calls/ video visits @ \$100 per call/ video and 4 in-person visits to be decided after the calls for the 2017/2018 budget. If approved, all clubs will have been attended to by the 2019 season.

Start a Synchro Team Initiative:

- Grant covers the cost of bringing out an experienced MB synchro coach to help choreograph and support the new team/coach. Parent orientation sessions were also delivered.
- Benefits: Builds confidence of coach and club just getting off the ground. Secondly, creates a connection the new synchro coach develop and mentor.
- 5 applications received by Oct. 19. Committee elected to split \$1000 between 3 Clubs: Rivers had 8 skaters ready to go (\$500); Roblin had 4 skaters (\$250); Niverville had 4 skaters (\$250).
- Meghan Sprung worked with Rivers;
- Tammy McKay worked with Roblin.
- Niverville was not able to find enough skaters. Their portion of the grant (\$250) was transferred to Roblin.
- Both Roblin and Rivers teams registered and competed at Crocus.

Synchro Choreography: Thanksgiving Oct. 7-9, 2016

- Friday/Saturday in Morris; Sunday in Killarney
- World Gold Medal Coach Lee Chandler led the choreo sessions
- 3 teams participated: U of M Open, Brandon Open and Pembina Pre-Novice
- Open teams paid \$800 for 8hrs. They were also responsible to cover their own ice costs. The Pre-Novice team paid \$285 for 2.5 hrs, plus their ice costs.
- It was open to all teams; however, many were unable to participate due to the earliness in the synchro season and conflicting family Thanksgiving events

Next season: Exploring option of using the weekend *after* Thanksgiving as well as offering a skill development session for individual synchro skaters to get more skaters and coaches participating.

Synchro Monitoring: Dec. 10, 2016 in Carberry

- 5 teams participated: Killarney Elementary and Pre-Novice, Neepawa Elementary and Pre-Novice, and Brandon Open
- Central Region teams (at least 3) did not attend as they had a test day the same weekend.

 - Synchro was also offered at the North-South Westman and Central Plains Regionals, however no teams registered in those regions.
 - Each skater received a ribbon and a certificate
- Skate Canada plans to implement the Skate to Standard synchro across the country for 2017-2018.

Recommendation: Better publicize fact that Beginner synchro is now offered at Regional competitions. This was new for 2016-2017 and was missed by some coaches.

Coach Support and Tools

- Parkland Coaches were invited to shadow experienced synchro coaches at Crocus. Goal: share knowledge and experience with coaches interested in developing synchro in their clubs. One coach took advantage of this opportunity and was paired up with 2 different coaches during the day.
- We'd like to develop on online tool where MB synchro coaches can post their synchro related questions and we can help find the answers. The goal being to strengthen the knowledge, understanding and skills of our current synchro coaches so that our skaters prosper and our teams are prepared leading up to their first competitions.

Synchro Judge Development

- Manitoba synchro needs more judges and technical specialists. The cost to bring in 2-4 outside officials for 2-3 synchro competitions a year is upwards of \$800+ per official per event. On an annual basis, it's an investment of \$3,200 \$10,000. With some upfront investment to train local officials, the need to bring in so many officials will be reduced and the Section will see cost savings for its members.
- To have officials trained and certified, funds should be budgeted for two things: the initial training seminar and then the funds/commitment to trial the judges so can get their qualifications. Manitoba has limited competitions and levels so worth investigating if video trialing is an option.

Synchro Competition Format

- Synchro committee would like to explore possibility of changing non-qualifying competition format.
 Instead of scheduling 10-12 min practices in the morning, have all teams compete twice. Optional practices could be sold the evening prior to the event. First team performance would be worth 50% of their score (like a short program), then the second performance would be worth 100% (like a Free Skate). Teams would receive 2 report cards.
- Next steps: Synchro Committee to consult other Sections who operate their competitions like this. Consult MB synchro coaches. Determine plan for Skate to Standard Teams (Beginner 1 and 2). Determine which events to follow the above propose format.

Regional Upcoming Game Plan

• Seminar fall of 2017:

- Consider a three region seminar if possible (Winnipeg, Interlake, Eastman)
- Winnipeg will reach out to Eastman and Interlake to see if a joint seminar is desirable to all three regions
- Request ice at Terry Sawchuk for similar time of year (after SaskSkate, before Sectionals), possibly even after Sectionals once STARSkaters are back on the ice (some programs just are beginning in mid-October)

Regional Competition 2018

- Winnipeg Region would like to strongly recommend that this competition be offered in Winnipeg each year. There was a significant difference in the number of skaters who participated in this event when it was held in the city
- o Will be hosted by Century the next time it is held in Winnipeg

Constitution

- Restructuring was discussed: a draft constitution will be presented at Winnipeg Region
 AGM
 - Draft Regional Committee structure includes: Regional Director, Assistant Regional Director and a Judges Bureau Representative (2 of the 3 positions will be held by representatives from different clubs or schools in the region)
 - Proposal includes freezing the Regional bank account for one year and then distributing funds between both clubs (SKW and CSC)
 - Events would be decided based on consensus between both clubs and will be shared or hosted by individual clubs

Winnipeg Region Top Successes

- 1. Test Days on session low test days have decreased testing costs and risk with booking ice; Thanks to Skate Winnipeg who hosted both high test days this season
- 2. Regional competition hosted by SKW a well-run event providing many skaters in our region with an excellent competition experience

Winnipeg Region Top issues

- 1. REGIONAL COMPETITION RESTRUCTURE: A significantly greater number of skaters participated in regionals when they were held in Winnipeg in January 2017 as compared to a far lower number in lle des Chenes in 2016. In a region where parents have so many recreational choices for their children, travel at this level is a deterrent. We know that working towards and participating in a competition is one of the many things that bring a skater back year after year and are very concerned that we are losing skaters because of the travel requirement to participate in a regional competition at the STARSkate level, our recreational skaters.
- 2. Restructuring our regional committee with a difficulty in recruiting volunteers
- **3.** Decrease in Number of Skaters (fewer moving from CanSkate into STARSkate; experienced skaters retiring)
