Finance/Grant

- Sport Manitoba Funding for the 2017-18 Fiscal Year \$134,000
- Our Sport Manitoba Funding for the 2018-19 Fiscal Year will not be released until June 2018
- Sport Manitoba Coaching Department also provides grants based upon availability and up-to a maximum of \$1,200 per year
- Skate Canada provides us with a share of the membership registration fees collected and test fee's. The value of the grant we anticipate for the 2018-19 Fiscal year is \$93,000
- With new Provincial budget that was released in the middle of March, Sport Manitoba is currently reviewing the funding decrease that was received. How the reduction will affect our funding or their programs and initiatives we will have to wait and see. They are currently working through this process. If there are any significant changes we will share the information to all those that is appropriate to do so.

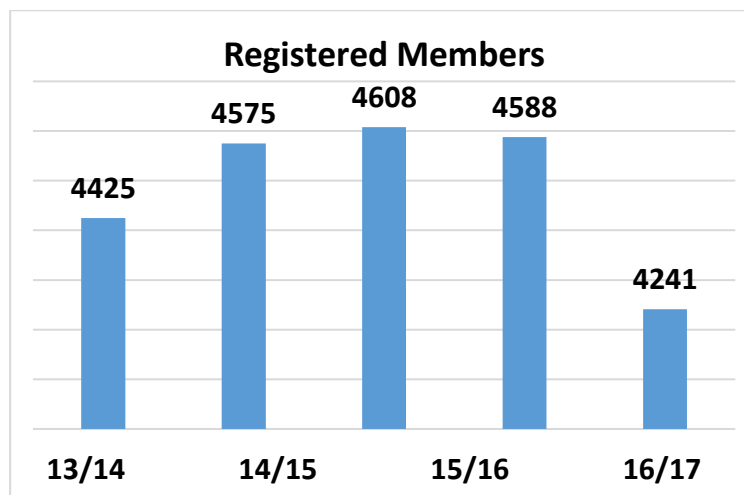
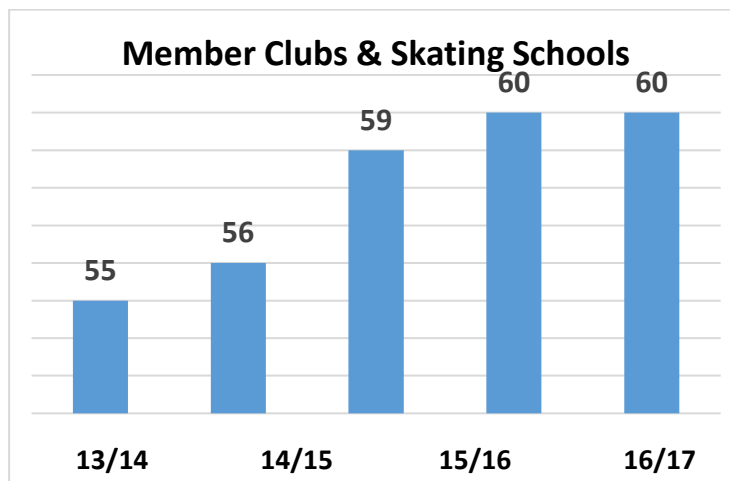

Technical Director Board Report

September 2017 Report

Not having many events in the past quarter, the last few months has presented an opportunity to analyze the structure of our committees, and the programs being delivered. Each committee is running fairly independently of each other, and one of the objectives moving forward will be to not only ensure that the strategic of direction of the individual committee are in line, but to make sure they integrate with each other. Further to this, steps have been taken in the past few months to ensure that each program that we deliver this year has a distinct and clear measurability. This will ensure that when we review the programs' success at the end of the year, that we can accurately assess the viability of the program moving forward.

Officials

We have seen a new chair step into the official's role this fiscal year. There has been one officials meeting in the past quarter. One of the main objectives from the Technical Director perspective will be to ensure proper mentorship and succession planning is in place, as well as integrating the official's initiatives with the coaches. There is a key point to consider as we work to develop a strong relationship not only within our official's community, but with the coaches as well.

****The new STAR 1-5 program means that coaches will be doing their own assessments from STAR 1-5. ****

This means that there will no longer be low test days. Low test days were a great way for coaches, and officials to share information, and to make sure that there was a consistent standard across the province. We will have to take the absence of this into account as we move forward with both Official's initiatives, as well as coaching initiatives.

The officials committee in conjunction with the Technical Director are developing cost effective programming aid in officials "back to basics", as well as integrating coaching into this programming. The outcome of this program is to ensure constant delivery of information, as well as to strengthen the relationship between officials and coaches.

Coaches

There have been 4 NCCP clinics since the last report, and although it is exciting to see coaches starting their journey through the NCCP process, there have been many areas highlighted where the Technical Director should focus on.

- 1) Lack of National Level Coaches: Skate Canada Manitoba has a huge deficit of active National Level Coaches. This provides problems in mentorship capabilities, as well as development opportunities for our skaters. In a risk assessment view, programming should be developed now to mitigate the potential that in 5-10 years we may have no National Level Coaches remaining.
- 2) Lack of Male Coaches: Skate Canada in Conjunction with the Canada Games Council have released their tech package for the 2019 Canada Winter Games. It states that to have male skaters on your team, you MUST have a National Certified Male Coach as a Team coach. This presents a huge problem for Skate Canada Manitoba. In the interim, we have identified one male coach to move through the NCCP system. As a long-term focus, programming and initiatives must be developed to retain male's skaters as they move through their skating career. This should be a collaborative effort between the Coaching, Officials, and Skating Programs committees.

- 3) Coaches attaining Certification: One of the largest challenges Skate Canada Manitoba will face in the foreseeable future. Many of our coaches who are moving through the NCCP system are failing to be certified. This is due largely to lack of mentorship, and technical knowledge. An initiative has just been initiated to combat these issues. These young coaches will be our future. Ensuring they have strong technical knowledge, and the province behind them will be a huge step in retention, and development of better skating.

There will be a program developed to help support the young coaches moving through the Regional Coaching Stream. We will be reaching out to all Regional Coaches, and offering a seminar highlighting specific problem areas identified by our Learning Facilitator, Technical Director, and Skate Canada. Mentorship after the seminar will be ongoing. There is a grant process underway, and Skate Canada will also be supporting the initiative with staff (Monica Lockie as a Clinician). Details are still being worked out.

Skating Programs:

ALL STAR: Details are being finalized for the ALL-STAR seminars upcoming this fall. Following the seminars and post-event reports, this program will go under review for viability, clarity of objectives, and measurability. It is important to note, that 2 regions will not be running ALL-STAR seminars this fall. Winnipeg, and potentially Central. If this program is to move forward, clear objectives must be laid out, as well, as well as the importance of the Regions complying to running the seminars.

With the new STAR 1-5 program role out this fall, work will need to be done in collaboration with the Technical Director, Coaching committee, and STAR U clinicians to ensure consistent delivery of this program across the province. Work is being done on developing a system to identify clubs in need of assistance.

SYNCHRO: Synchro is a massive part of the Sport for Life Model. The main objective this season will be to identify if the programming being executed reaches the objectives laid out by the committee. Synchro may have the most difficult task of all the other Skating Programs in developing their programming, as we have 2 competitive teams, and the rest being recreational. Last season we saw a lack of engagement in the budgeted programming by the recreational teams. Participation, clarity, and measurability will be the focus. At the end of season, all programs will be assessed for their viability and direction.

COMPETITIVE: The largest change this season has been team structure. This may be the first time where we see skaters moving up within our team structure, as well as being asked to leave. The focus of the teams this year will be accountability, and engagement in their yearly plans and training schedules.

IST – In the last few seasons the participation in Strength and Conditioning has been largely unmonitored, and un-attended. The Strength and Conditioning Program in collaboration with Sport Manitoba has been completely re-vamped. In Winnipeg alone, attendance has improved from 1-2 skaters per week, to 13-16 skaters per week.

In addition to a re-vamped Strength and Conditioning Program, effort has been directed to the importance of yearly plans. Skaters were required to produce yearly plans for their season. These plans will integrate Sports Psychology, Strength and Conditioning, as well as the Coaches. The objective is to for the skater to see the importance of proper planning and having all resources available to them on the same page.

Please See competitive report for more details on programming.

March 2018 Report

The past six months has been a steady stream of competition and programming that has left little down time for skaters, coaches, and volunteers. From qualifying competitions, to NCCP Clinics, to Manitoba Winter Games, it has been a season of ups and downs with success's and short comings.

The previous Technical Director Report dated September 14th, 2017 outlined many initiatives including:

- 1) Reinforcing the Strategic Direction of the committee's
- 2) Developing measurable protocols for programming
- 3) Developing a stronger link and continuity between committee's

As the last 6 months have been focused on the execution of previously budgeted programs, the coming months will have a stronger focus on the above. The following report will outline an assessment of the last 6 months of programming from the perspective of the Technical Director.

COMPETITIVE

Simulations – September 2017 in Virden, MB

The out of province officials in attendance were:

- 1) Karen Howard – Olympic level Judge
- 2) Brett Hines – National Level Technical Specialist

In previous years, the competitive committee would choose two local officials to fill the other two seats. (One Technical Specialist/Controller and one Judge). To support the development of stronger links between the committees, it was decided that the Officials committee would choose the local official to join Karen Howard as a mentoring opportunity. This proved to be a valuable experience for our local official and will continue to be the standard moving forward.

At the Simulation event, Karen also delivered a 2-hour presentation to our skaters covering GOE's, and the interruption rule. Leveraging the knowledge of our guest official to deliver valuable information to our skaters and coaches will be implemented in coming years.

The 2017 Simulations included skaters from Juvenile to Senior. The number of skaters for the weekend was 47. Post event discussions with our out of province officials were centered around the viability of having such a large number of skaters at one simulation event. To ensure an undiluted experience for our higher-level skaters and based on the recommendation of our competitive committee and out of province guests, the format of next year's simulation will be altered to reflect these discussions.

- 1) The September simulations will only include Pre-Novice, Novice, Junior and Senior level skaters.
- 2) There will be a separate simulation event for STAR 5, Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile skaters.

The September simulation event will continue to use out of province officials chosen by the competitive committee, while the officials committee will choose local officials that may benefit from mentoring experience. The separate simulation event for the lower levels will pull from our local official pool and be at a time of year that is more in line with the yearly plan of the lower level skaters.

Training Burst (Karen Howard 1 on 1)

Following this year's simulations, Karen Howard graciously volunteered her time for an additional day to focus closer on a few skaters. Karen, who does talent ID on a National scale, and within her own section made her selections for the proposed visit and passed them off to the TD. In October, Karen visited these skaters and did lessons including the coach and skater for approximately ½ an hour per skater. There was also an off-ice portion with a presentation focusing around program components. The skaters saw a huge benefit from this day, and focused time with skater and coach with an ISU level official proved to be a valuable experience.

Sectionals/ Challenge

For interest in specific result placements please refer to the Executive Director Report.

Although there have been significant improvements made in the overall scores at both our Sectional Event, and Challenge Events. I fear we are falling farther behind on a National Scale.

Skate Canada Manitoba currently has the following spots available to us for the Skate Canada Challenge Event:

- 1) Pre-Novice – 3
- 2) Novice – 3
- 3) Junior – 2
- 4) Senior – 2

If we have skaters placing in the top 3 spots at Sectionals, there should be no issue in having the CMS (minimum score to attend challenge). The perception of the CMS must change. Currently it is a score only achieved by our highest level of skaters. Our goal should be that it is a score that is a benchmark for our top 6-8 skaters. Nationally it is a minimum score to reflect the bottom level skaters at the Challenge level. If we have skaters placing in the top 3 at our Sectional Event who do not have the minimum score (which was the case this year) then this means we have much work to do.

Following the Technical Director meeting at Challenge, it is evident that Skate Canada is looking to significantly raise the bar and as a Section we must be prepared to follow suit. The following is coming down the pipeline.

- 1) Challenge numbers for Pre-Novice and Novice will be reduced from 60 to 48 (or less)
- 2) A significant increase in the CMS in the next two years.

What does this mean for our skaters? A streamlined challenge may mean that we have a significantly smaller Manitoba Challenge Team in years to come. Our skaters typically fall in the bottom third of placements at Challenge and as a whole struggle to achieve the current CMS. More work than ever will have to be done to be viable and relevant.

This could have implications on:

- a) Our organization as a whole
- b) Advancement of Coaches
- c) Advancement of Skaters
- d) Funding

Manitoba Winter Games

A huge thank you should be extended to the host Club/ City for all of their efforts in putting together the Manitoba Winter Games event in conjunction with Sport Manitoba and Skate Canada Manitoba.

- 1) 46 Skaters participated in these games
- 2) 2 out of province officials in attendance.

Both out of province officials were trained in TC and TS. They both possessed an excellent skill set and expressed interest in returning to Manitoba for further competitions.

Junior Development Seminar

Another successful year this year with 35 young skaters from STAR 1-10 and Pre-Juvenile in attendance. On ice clinicians were Deidre Russell and Kaleigh Hole. Off ice was facilitated by the TD as well as Sport Manitoba. This seminar continues to be both financially viable, and a great opportunity for the young skaters to get a good grasp on a Team Structure that may be in their future.

Team Structure

The new Team Structure has been released and applications are under way for the 2018-19 season.

Changes this year include the following:

- 1) An increase in minimum score requirements for Development, High Performance and Elite athletes
- 2) Additional Technical Requirements for High Performance and Elite Athletes
- 3) Implementation of Juvenile U12 champion (Sectionals and STAR) into the High-Performance Program
- 4) Addition of Pair and Dance into Team Structure

Additional changes this year will include:

- a) Assessment of the Strength and Conditioning program delivery, specifically on location of programs
- b) Improvement to communication of additional benefits of team structure, including video submissions and feedback sessions

Application will close on March 19th, 2018 and the new team will be announced prior to April 15th.

ALL STAR

The ALL STAR budget has been completely torn down, with a new 3 phase program being initiated this coming fiscal year. In previous years the budget was focused around the subsidy of ALL STAR Seminars in the form of covering the cost of the clinician. Although Skate Canada Manitoba will continue to encourage regions to run Regional STAR seminars, the subsidy money will no longer be available. The new 3-phase role out will be focused on ensuring proper delivery of the new STAR Programming and will be organized by the Section.

- 1) Monica Lockie from Skate Canada and the creator of the new STAR program will deliver a 3-day event at the AGM for Coaches/ Skaters and Club Executive
- 2) Skate Canada Manitoba will deliver 3 or 4 seminars in the fall of 2018. The Sessions will be 3 prong, with a strong focus on program delivery for both coaches and club executives, while also giving a beneficial seminar for the skaters
- 3) The final stage will leverage the STAR University Trained Facilitators by performing site visits and/or calls to each club in the section to ensure proper support in delivery of the new program

COACHES

In the previous Technical Report there was 3 main points of interest outlined.

- 1) Lack of National Level Coaches
- 2) Lack of Male Coaches
- 3) Coaches not attaining Certification

The focus over the past 4 months has been around the 3rd point. By focusing on the young coaching talent, it will only serve to aid in working toward the goal of both having a larger pool of male coaches and larger pool of National Level Coaches.

Phase 1 and 2 of the new ALL-STAR program has been designed to target the areas that were challenges for coaches attempting to gain certification in the Regional Coaching Stream. A portion of the Seminar delivered by Monica Lockie will specifically focus on the areas recognized by the TD as areas in where most of the Regional Coaches are failing their certification.

There was 1 NCCP clinic delivered since September which was a condensed ISPC (Provincial Level Clinic). The clinic was run specifically to meet the Canada games Requirement of having a Male coach at a National Level and to assist our coaches who required this certification for competitive skaters and Synchro. We did have 7 participants and did not incur a large cost.

3. Existing sponsors-Victoria Inn Hotel & Convention Centre, Portage Veterinary Hospital, Inner Edge Skate & Dance Shop

Victoria Inn provides cash and a rebate/stay, Portage Veterinary Hospital sponsors initiatives in the Athlete Development program areas and Inner Edge sponsors team clothing items. Enterprise Car Rental provides a 4% rebate on rentals. We need to encourage our members to support our sponsors. It was suggested SCMB should communicate with our sponsors regularly, provide updates, send thank-you (pic of HP team) etc.

4. Potential Partnership Opportunities

- a) **Forks Partnership** - The committee is exploring the possibility of skating demos/events at the Forks that clubs and skaters can participate in to promote skating. The Forks will be contacted to discuss a promo event.
- b) **Canada 150 program** - Skate Canada has hired a company to coordinate a national skating day celebration in cooperation with the Lieutenant Governors. SCMB has received the skates, helmets which are in storage. The skates & helmets can be used for other promotional activities. **Clothing** - The SCMB office has been in touch with Mondetta to provide clothing for SCMB. Bargains is another option suitable for less expensive promo items. There will be discussions with a few clothing companies to see what they can offer to SCMB in discounts or clothing sponsorship. This can be for team clothing and or discounts to all skaters.
- c) **Shaw TV & Shaw Direct**- Shaw TV provided skating coverage last year and Shaw Direct sponsored some of our Skating Events in 2017. The committee will contact Shaw to see if they are willing to provide additional event coverage and sponsorship opportunities again this season.

5. Update on SCMB – Strategic Direction

Test Days – There were 30 test days requested during the period from Nov.1st –March 31st. There were 20 test days requested in the period from April 1st-Oct.31st. 11 test days were cancelled related to low numbers of tests. A breakdown of test days & evaluators per region are listed below:

The Manitoba Section has 27 Evaluators/Judges and 9 individuals that are only qualified to judge competitions which leaves 19 officials available to evaluate at test days. There are 3 evaluators qualified at Senior Bronze level and 1 Evaluator at Junior Silver level. There are 13 evaluators that are qualified at the Gold level. STAR 1-5 tests are assessed by coaches. Evaluated tests are from Senior Bronze to Gold in all disciplines.

Judges qualified at the following levels: Senior (2), Junior (2), Novice (11) Juvenile (8) STAR 1-4 (7) Recruitment & Retention of Judges/Evaluators continue to be a concern as many of our judges are busy with competitions as well as accommodating all the test days during the skating year. I would like to thank the Judges Committee for all their support and guidance as well as all the Evaluator/Judges and the Judges Bureau Reps that covered all the test days & competitions.

- iv. Jessica Watson travelled to Gimli twice (Nov. 18 and Dec. 9). On ice, the team had a base program set, so they worked on synchro skating technique and simplifying some of the choreography. Jessica also led a parent meeting to discuss team building. During the second day, they held an off-ice with the skaters which covered the Skate to Standard marking system and example videos of gold, silver, and bronze level elements. Gimli's Beginner team attended Synchro Champs in Beausejour.

b. Choreography/Skills Weekend

- i. Held Oct. 19-22 in Stonewall, Winnipeg, Carberry, MacGregor and Morris.
- ii. Nichole Manahan of Nexxice led all sessions
- iii. Four teams participating in choreography sessions. (Hazelridge and Pembina Pre-Novice, U of M Open and Brandon Adult 1).
- iv. Skills Session and Coaching Session: 9 coaches signed up and 38 skaters registered for the Skills session in MacGregor
- v. Budget: A profit was made with the skills session of \$496.
- vi. Timing: Oct. 19-22 was too late for choreography to be ready to compete in early January. Recommend advancing the choreography portion to late September. May consider separating out the skills/coaching session from the choreography session, as the skills session is still best done in later October as some rural teams don't begin their seasons until early October.

Pilot Mound's coach asked about the cancelling of test days and the reason why. Wondering why there aren't enough high-test days. Suggestion for the Competition Committee

- In the Competition Grid, we would like to recommend for discussion by the Events Management Committee:
 - stipulate the town/city who will act as host. If a club hosted a REGIONAL or SYNCHRO competition the previous year, they would receive a bye for the competition hosts. For example, if they hosted a regional in 2019, they are on the list for Crocus in 2020 – if they qualify.
 - The Competition Committee would assign competitions based on the club venue report. This way, towns will not be assigned a competition impossible to host. The Regional Director is responsible for reporting changes to a club's venue size to the Competition Committee.
 - Volunteer Burn Out
 - i. The Competition Committee will contact the local high schools in those areas and offer this volunteer opportunity to the students.
 - ii. The hours can be applied for school credit.
 - iii. Our skaters can talk about the benefits of volunteering to their friends, teachers, etc., and promote the competition.
 - iv. The Competition Committee can also contact former skaters from Skate Manitoba/Skate Canada from the past to attend the competitions for a meet and greet.
 - v. Volunteers would receive free admission, one silent auction ticket and a free brochure (which they can have the former skater autograph.) People like free.
