


OFFICIAL




Skate Canada is committed to improving recruitment and retention of our officials as a way of strengthening our capacity to deliver high-quality programs and competitions.

BECOME A JUDGE/EVALUATOR



Judges officiate at all levels of competitions and are responsible for assessing the quality of the elements of a skater or team. **Evaluators** assess skaters during tests.

WHY BECOME A JUDGE/EVALUATOR?

For the love of skating. To stay involved and give back to the sport. To be part of a community!

WHO CAN BE A JUDGE/EVALUATOR?

Must be at least 16 years of age;

STAR 5 & up: must have a complete Senior Bronze Test or two complete Junior Bronze tests

HOW DO I BECOME A JUDGE/EVALUATOR?

Training is offered by the Skate Canada Sections and consists of clinics, trial judging and examinations.

BECOME A TECHNICAL PANEL OFFICIAL

Working as a team the technical panel is responsible for the correct identification of elements and levels of difficulty of these elements when attempted by skaters and teams in competition.

WHY BECOME A TECHNICAL PANEL OFFICIAL?

For the love of skating. To stay involved and give back to the sport. To be part of a community!

WHO CAN BE A TECHNICAL PANEL OFFICIAL?

Must be at least 16 years of age

Have one complete Senior Bronze Test or two complete Junior Bronze tests

HOW DO I BECOME A TECHNICAL PANEL OFFICIAL?

Training is offered by the Skate Canada Sections and consists of attending a national technical panel seminar and passing a series of exams.



DATA SPECIALIST



Data specialists calculate the marks awarded by the judges and the technical panel.

WHY BECOME A DATA SPECIALIST?

For the love of skating. To stay involved and give back to the sport. To be part of a community!

WHO CAN BE A DATA SPECIALIST?

Must be at least 16 years of age;

No previous skating experience is required.

HOW DO I BECOME A DATA SPECIALIST?

Skate Canada Sections train all new data specialists.
After an introductory training session, training continues at a competition under the guide of more experienced data specialists.

STAR 1-4 JUDGE

The STAR 1-4 competition program is where figure skating begins! It is designed to introduce skaters to performing and eventually competing.

As a STAR 1-4 judge you will work as part of a team to identify and assess the quality of the elements performed by skaters in competition.

You will help create a fun, relaxed environment, that will contribute to a positive first competition experience for the skaters.

WHY BECOME A STAR 1-4 JUDGE?

For the love of skating. To stay involved and give back to the sport. To be part of a community! Becoming a STAR 1-4 judge is a great way to give officiating a try and to learn more about the sport.

WHO CAN BE A STAR 1-4 JUDGE?

Must be 16 years of age or older. No previous skating experience is required.

Current and former skaters, parents, NCCP-certified coaches, anyone who has a love of the sport.
