We started with the Ransomware attack on the Sport Manitoba Network which started on June 12, 2019 and ended at the beginning of September (with some small challenges fixed soon after). Below I have summarized some of the items that may not appear in our Committee's reports for your information and then please take the time to review all of committee's reports to see what they have accomplished this past year!

Finance/Grants

- Sport Manitoba funding for the 2019-2020 Fiscal year is \$113,500 + \$46,500 (Sport Program funding – formerly Bingo money).
- MB Government has advised Sport MB that their funding will be the same as in 2019-20, so that is great news for all sports
- Our Sport Manitoba funding for the 2020-21 Fiscal year will not be release date is currently unknown due to the change in submission dates due to COVID 19
- Sport Manitoba Coaching Department also provides grants based upon availability
- Skate Canada provides us with grants from member registrations (skaters, coaches, officials and executive members), and test fees. The value of this year's grant is anticipated to be approximately \$90,000

Skate Canada Manitoba is creating a new 5-year Strategic Plan. The plan will be in place for 2021-2026 with a transitional year in 2020-21. Information will be shared with all our stakeholders as we get closer to the completion phase.

TECHNICAL CONSULTANT REPORT Submitted by: Cadfan Edwards

Section Data

Understanding the needs of the Section, and the direction of our committee's means not only understanding the needs of the members we have but also how our ratio's compare to other sections in the country.

Section Membership numbers per capita:

Skate Canada Average	1 member for every 199 people

The success of our programs cannot be measured purely by numbers. Membership numbers however do provide insight into the health of our organization. Larger numbers and programs provide more opportunities for funding, great numbers of coaches, officials and skaters. We see the need of membership on many levels.

Affects

- i. Coaching difficult to attract/ retain/ and move coaches through the NCCP structure
- ii. Skaters Difficult for skaters striving to achieve high performance
- iii. Parents Often the financial responsibility of lower ratio of skaters on the ice falls on the parents
- iv. Club Lower registration numbers means juggling ice times. We are now seeing lower turnover of CanSkate skaters to figure skaters Clubs are also losing CanSkate membership to city run programs
- v. Section Section includes all the above, but also includes financial implications.

The membership numbers of our organization have fluctuated over the years, but on average we are on a downward trend. Five years ago, our membership average was 1 Skate Canada Member for every 273 people. A strategic direction that brings our membership numbers more in line with the National Average is a goal that will provide the registrant numbers we need to support the list above. What would being in line with the National Average look like?

Skate Canada Manitoba membership in line with the National Average would be 6800 members. The financial benefit from Skate Canada Membership alone would be over \$80,000 annually. We would also see financial benefits from an increase in competition revenue. Does it cost more to support the membership? Absolutely, but the economies of scale would be in our favor.

The question then becomes why our numbers are so far below the National Average. By running the Rural Numbers vs, the City numbers, the answer becomes very clear.

Brandon Ratio - 1 Skate Canada Member for every 255 people Winnipeg Ratio – 1 Skate Canada Member for every 1749 people Rural Ratio – 1 Skate Canada Member for every 162 people

Our reality in Manitoba is that the majority of the population lives in 2 cities. Although I do not think we can ignore the growth and support of our rural clubs, the statistics clearly highlight where we need to concentrate on increasing our membership. Based on Skate Canada statistics, Winnipeg alone should have the capacity to support 3500 members.

We do have clubs functioning, and viable financially in Winnipeg. It is clear however that the population can support up to 10x the membership. As a Section it is our responsibility to develop strategies to bring the numbers more in line to where they need to be. There are only two solutions to this. Support the existing clubs in building their membership numbers (in cities with a comparable population density many have clubs with 1000 + members) or develop programs and initiatives to aid in the development of new clubs; or a combination of both.

Other statistics:

Other statistics gathered has been the average number of coaches/ officials/ and program specific skaters as it relates to other provinces.

There are some important points we can pool from this data.

Coaches

With a coach ratio of 1 coach for every 28 members we are higher than the national average, and perhaps more importantly higher than Sections who achieve high levels of success. As we look to build membership numbers and support programming this can be achieved with proper training of the current coach base we have. Where we can look to improve is by providing programming and mentoring our coaches through the NCCP Structure.

Although the low National Level Coach statistics have already been identified, the breakdown paints a picture of our failure to move coaches through the NCCP structure. This barrier is amplified by our lack of high-level coaches to act as mentors.

Skaters

The ratio of CanSkate, STAR 1-5, and Juvenile through Senior are on par with the National Average. The number where we are falling behind is STAR 6-Gold. What does this mean? There are a few things that this statistic shows us.

- i. Our skaters/ clubs and coaches are not viewing the 6-Gold as viable programming. This also means we have skaters in the competitive stream that may be better suited for STAR 6-Gold
- ii. 6-Gold is built to retain skaters that are not suited to the competitive stream. This is a tactic to support Skate for Life. Not utilizing the program could mean we are losing skaters that otherwise might have remained in the sport, and pursed officiating or coaching beyond their skating years.

At this moment it is speculative on where and how we are losing our athletes; however, it is a number and statistic that is of importance, and that I wish to pursue.

Athlete Development Integrated Funding Model

- I. Introduction
- II. Previous Funding Model
- III. Proposed Model and Rational

I. Introduction

As a response to the Data above this new integrated funding model has been proposed to the Executive. The previous approach to both funding and committee structure was disjointed and promoted a lack of cohesiveness between both different levels of athletes, as well as coaches, athletes and officials. The outcome is an ineffectiveness in results as they relate to growth and progression.

There have been several changes to funding models, as well as an upcoming revised LT(A)D that will serve to support this new proposed structure.

II. <u>Previous Funding Model</u>

The previous funding model and committee structure was largely separated by category or programming. This in turn had some alignment with the LT(A)D. These committee's sole focus was singular in nature. For example

- The competitive committee and its programs were directed towards the athletes that it served.
- The coaching committee and its programs were directed towards the coaches it served

Although there were undeniably programs in the competitive committee that benefited the coaches of the athletes in the program, and conversely programs in the coaching committee's structure that benefited athletes, this was not a directive of the committees. Exacerbating this was a failure of integration within the committees to discuss the alignment of their needs and deficiencies while developing their prospective programming.

Committee's

- A) CanSkate STAR committee
 - This committee's focus was
 - I. CanSkate
 - II. STAR 1-5
 - III. CanPower

This served active start, fundamentals and Learn to Train in the new LTD model

B) Competitive

This committee's focus was the TEAM TOBA structure which included

- I. Star 4-5 Team Members
- II. Pre-Juv and Juv Team Members
- III. Pre-Novice to Senior Team Members

This served Learn to Train, Train to Train, Train to Train and Train to Compete in the new LTD Model

What we derive from the info above is that.

- A) Active for life is not served
- B) The largest portion of the expense is spent in the TEAM TOBA structure, or Learn to Train through Train to Compete
- C) Active Start and Learn to Train are largely underserved
- D) Largely programs with results that were not distinctively measurable

iii. <u>Proposed Model</u>

Skate Canada's funding approach in the next quadrennial is seeing a complete shift in focus. In past quadrennials Skate Canada's funding model was centered on an "Own the Podium" directive. This would encourage funding at the Train to Train through Train to Compete Model. The model Skate Canada is shifting towards is centered on grass roots programming.

This model both supports the way we should look at directing our finances and aligns itself closely with the new LTD.

There will be 4 objectives with the new proposed Model. These directives will attempt to combine our limited resources of qualified volunteers and improve efficiencies in the way we spend our money.

- 1) Cohesiveness in programming across all levels of the LT(A)D
- 2) Provide targeted outcomes with measurable results
- 3) Appropriate spends on the areas that we currently have deficits
- 4) Integrate the 3 pillars to athlete development in budgetary items (Athletes/ Coaches/ Officials).
- A) Committee Makeup

The proposed committee would include ALL areas of the new LTD Structure.

- I. Active Start
- II. FUNdamentals
- III. Learn to Train
- IV. Train to Train
- V. Train to Compete
- VI. Train to Win
- VII. Active for Life

This will make the most effective use of talent, as well as provide a cohesiveness throughout our programming structure.

It is vital that programs within the Athlete Development committee include all three pillars important to athlete development. The foundation of all the Athlete Development Committee's programming is covering the full LT(A)D. The pillars resting on that foundation are the following.

- I. Coaches
- II. Athletes
- III. Officials

Each of the programming will have identifiable deliverables and measures in place to ensure viability of the program moving forward. Some of the programs are specific to one of the three pillars, while some integrate two pillars or three into the program.

The following are programs that we are planning on executing for the upcoming season

- HP Seminar
- Training Bursts
- HP Simulation
- IST
- HP Coach Education
- Junior Development Seminar
- Club Development (Program in development stages, no detailed budget approved)
- All STAR Seminars
- CanSkate/ CanPower/ Active for life Initiatives
- STAR Support
- Athlete Retention Program (In Development)

The Executive in conjunction with the Technical Consultant through the course of many meetings explored the ratio of money spent on grass roots programming as compared to HP programming. Due to funding

requirements and needs it was decided that the ratio should be at a 50/50 split for the foreseeable future, or until needs/ or funding models change.

The following graph indicates (in line with the new LTD) where Skate Canada Manitoba will be focusing our expenses. An important note is that in the Train to Train model, a portion of that amount will be benefiting the Learn to Train even though it is not included in the chart.



The new committee structure will ensure the few talented and dedicated people available are used effectively. The new budgetary requests adhere to the funding requirements, the objective set by the executive, and are in line with the needs of the section.

Club Development Directive

Included in the information in the Athlete Development Model is a re-direction of funds towards club directives. These programs will include (inclusively or indirectly).

- i. CanSkate Initiative
- ii. CanPower Initiative
- iii. STAR Support
- iv. Club Development Initiative

It is vital that during this transitional time of funding that the Section takes time to understand the needs of our clubs and align those needs with programming and initiatives that have made clubs successful in other areas.

Our clubs are vastly different in size and scope across the province. Some clubs function completely off fundraising dollars, while other clubs run a profit from delivered programming. It is important to take these differences into account when the development of programming occurs. Although these differences exist,

there is an alignment of many of the challenges faced by clubs across the province. These challenges include (but are not limited to)

- a) Coaching Access to qualified coaches that can work within the schedule of the club
- b) Volunteers Ability to draw in and retain volunteers to keep up with the workload and demand of the club responsibilities
- c) Relationships Lack of relationship with PSO and NSO. This includes getting a deeper understanding of the roles and responsibilities of the Section, the NSO, and the club. This also extends to where to find resources and support when necessary
- d) Facility Access to appropriate amount of ice-time to run efficient programming
- e) Marketing A perceived lack of support from PSO and NSO when it comes to marketing Skate Canada Programming
- f) Competition Perceived competition from either other clubs/ or locally ran Learn to Skate or Power skating Programs

Through club visits outside of the province there have been key areas identified that have made these clubs successful in membership, volunteerism and success.

- a) Coaching A unified group of coaches. Unified in their vision for the club as well as their contribution to the skaters and programming.
- b) Executive Strong outlines of responsibilities paired with strong succession planning and training.
- c) Roles Distinct roles between Executive and Coaching Team. The Head Coach (or programs director) making decisions on hires/ fires of coaches and programming. Executive working on membership communication/ financial strategies, marketing and community trends
- d) Junior Academy a well-defined bridging program as their largest financial contribution to the club

Strategy moving forward

It is evident that we cannot help all clubs in a massive capacity at the start of this project. It is important to take a two-tiered approach in which we can identify macro initiatives that can be widespread and used by all clubs, as well as a micro approach in which we work closely in different areas with select clubs.

<u>Macro Strategy</u> – Identifying common issues across the majority of clubs that can be tackled with low cost known solutions. These issues include

1) Coaching – Access to qualified coaches.

Long term the proposed Athlete Retention program should look to boost the number of qualified coaches available to clubs through driving skaters to continue in the sports through the NCCP Avenue.

Short Term the Regional Directors should reach out to all clubs in need of a coach for the upcoming season that are currently underserviced. This should be cross-referenced with a list of Active Coaches that the Section and NCCP Course Administrator can work through to make connections needed.

2) Relationships – Understanding of Roles and Responsibilities of PSO and NSO. Finding Resources Developing either a quick access package to clubs at the start of every season, OR a GOTO session going over resource guides and where to find information. Many of the information exists either on the PSO or NSO Website/Info Centre. Knowing where to find it, and who to call is more often the problem. With a small amount of planning this is a large hurdle that can be tackled efficiently.

3) Marketing – Perceived Lack of Support from PSO and NSO

The STAR portion of the Athlete Development Committee can work with the NSO on primarily existing marketing packages and develop a strategy or outline on how to delivery that to the clubs and communities. This aligns with the above issue as it is quite often not a matter of if the information exists, but more often where to find it.

4) Beginning discussions with Municipal Governments to engage in the conversation of switching City ran Learn to Skates to Skate Canada Programming.

This would be an internal effort primarily carried out by staff. It is clear that the obvious starting point (carrying most of Manitoba's Population) is the City of Winnipeg.

<u>Micro Strategy</u> – Working with a select number of clubs with more systemic hurdles with the goal of healthy running organizations with growing number of participants.

This would involve an application process in where Skate Canada Manitoba would look at providing resources both monetary and personal towards growing select clubs. These clubs will have a proven record of attendance and involvement with both PSO and NSO directives and programming.

Steps:

- i. Application process for club development with specific areas of admittance
- ii. Club visit with coaches and executive to collaboratively highlight areas of need
- iii. Skate Canada Manitoba internal review to strategize on areas to provide support
- iv. Strategies laid out to Executive and Coaches of the club
- v. Agreement made to engage in collaborative effort for support
- vi. Continued Monitoring of pre-indicated measurement markers

Conclusions:

With such large changes to funding models and NSO directives a large volume of work will need to be accomplished in the next year identifying gaps and developing programs to suite those needs that are measurable and effective. Grassroots programming is vital to the continued growth and Success of our Section.

One test day was cancelled because they didn't want to pay for 2 evaluators .Those tests went to Altona for Feb 23rd .Therefore the other four (4) dates were cancelled related to the lack of officials qualified in the STAR 6-Gold training related to the late roll out of this new training.

There was one Assessment day in January in conjunction with the Norman Competition. February had eight (8) test days completed at the end of the month. Skate Canada has assisted the Section in procuring an official for the Assessment day in Altona. Amber Lotz and Mary Ellen McDonald will be the evaluators for that date. There are approximately 6-7 hours of tests.

We have only ten (10) officials that are qualified to evaluate all the modules at the present time. We have a total of thirteen (13) evaluators that officiate at test days providing they complete their training in the Star 6-Gold training.

Unfortunately, some tests days have coincided with clinics making it difficult to fill test days and give our officials opportunities to attend clinics. Test days were cancelled in March related to the Corona Virus situation.

Programs

Start a Synchro Team Grant

Aimed at clubs starting up a new synchro teams or clubs with coaches new to synchro looking to gain knowledge and experience from a mentor coach. Helps layout choreography, provide advice on synchro element and transition execution, offer teaching progressions and orient clubs and parents to the successful operation of a synchro team.

Two teams were supported this season that both had coaches new to synchro: Revival, an Adult I team that trains out of Winnipeg (Niverville Skating Club) was supported by 3 visits with Megan Maxwell. Neepawa's *Ice Precise*, Juvenile and Pre-Novice teams were assisted by one visit from Tammy McKay as well a mentoring phone and email conversations with Jessica Watson.

Choreography Weekend

COLLABORATION - RESPECT - EXCELLENCE

Brings out a competitive coach for a weekend to choreograph programs. This highly beneficial program not only ensures teams' programs are choreographed according to new ISU requirements, but also has produced programs with improved flow and speed and innovative elements and transitions.

The committee budget covers the cost of the travel for the choreographer. Participating team's registration fees covers the hourly choreographer fee and new this season, ice costs were added to the teams' registration fees.

October 3-7, 2019 Locations: Winnipeg, Stonewall and Morris with 34 hrs of ice Choreographer: Lee Chandler Record 6 teams participated with a total of 81 skaters and 7 coaches (1 Pre-Novice, 1 Open, 4 Adult I)

Synchro Skills Session - Cancelled due to low registration

This session is open to all individual synchro skaters and coaches from Pre-Juvenile to Adult levels. It aims to develop skating skills including knees, edges, posture, tracking and more. It included two off-ice sessions: yoga and theatre (presentation a projection). Coaches have additional time alone with the clinician to get training tips on element execution.

Was planned for November 16 in McGregor with clinician Karen Ballinger, yoga instructor Jessica Watson and Theatre facilitator Alissa Watson. Unfortunately, it was cancelled since only 10 participants registered.

Recommendation for 2020: Increase marketing efforts with posters with facilitator profiles for clubs, and social media posts. Would the Marketing Committee be available to assist? Consider hosting session at a club with an existing synchro team.

Synchro Monitoring

Offers synchro teams the chance to receive feedback by both a synchro judge and technical specialist in time to make changes to their programs prior to the competitive season.

December 7, 2019 in Swan Lake Officials: Megan Maxwell (TS) and Holly Mayor (Judge) 7 teams participated: 1 Juvenile, 3 Pre-Novice, 2 Adult 1 and 1 Open team Officials wore skates for the sessions which allowed for more tips and feedback on correct execution of elements.

Competition Format

Second year with Synchro competition format where with teams competing twice in the same day. Positive feedback as teams are becoming more accustomed to this schedule. Beneficial as teams receive 2 report cards and officials' panels were used for the full competition day rather than just half the day.

Future consideration: 10-12 min practice sessions could be sold as optional depending on ice availability (the Friday evening before and morning of). This could help generate more revenue for the host club.

Synchro Coach Shadowing

Goal to encourage and provide guidance to coaches interested in starting up their own synchro team or seeking to observe more experience coaches and the management of their teams. Coaches were offered the opportunity to be paired up with a 2-3 different coaches to shadow them for the day at Prairie Regionals. Three coaches participated: Teddi Garvey, Megan Rafferty &Kim Smith.

Synchro Athlete Award

New award added to Sectional awards last season. Three applications were submitted.

Competition scheduling. This year Prairie Regionals were scheduled the same weekend as Winnipeg/Eastman regionals.  - 1.3. STARSKATE NUMBERS DECREASING
 - 1.4. Satellite site registration is through a separate Community Centre and collection of information on skaters and parents on ice can be challenging causing delays in registration with Skate Canada CanSkate and Power programs.

- No test days were held by CSC since February 25th, 2019. There were no available evaluators and few skaters at the high-test level.

Number of Executive:

- SKW has 14 members on the Executive including 3 non-voting consultants.
- Century has 9 members on the Executive.

Fundraising:

- SKW did not have any direct fundraising events this year. Money to support the club activities was raised during the competitions hosted.
- Century had a Pancake Breakfast and a Wine Raffle.

Skate Canada MB Day Held:

• Not held this year.

Ice Show / Carnival:

• SKW does a Showcase at the end of each the CanSkate Sessions it runs in the Fall/Winter session. CanSkaters show their skills learned during the session. In addition, Club skaters at differing skill levels (usually the program assistants for the session) perform to show possible progression from CanSkate

Constitution up to date:

- Revised at the Annual General Meeting of Skate Winnipeg, April 2017. It is due to be updated again.
- A recommendation has been made that we add to our constitution a requirement for any club operating in the City to take a turn hosting an event on a rotation grid.

Top 3 Struggles in Winnipeg Region for the year:

- 1. Hosting Events Sectionals/Simulations
 - Enormous ice costs/facility rental costs (ice cost of practice ice is HUGE, and not covered by registration fees).
 - High cost of official travel/accommodations, difficulty securing sponsorship and support from local businesses despite tremendous efforts.

• Difficulty coordinating volunteers and volunteer burnout. A HUGE amount of work for an event that did not break even (ended up in the hole!)

2. Volunteer Burnout

- Both clubs are experiencing significant volunteer burnout.
- SKW is looking for new ways to recruit new volunteers and utilize existing volunteers. The use of more committees and job sharing are under way.

3. Ice

 SKW had to cancel Sunday CanSkate session that was in an approximate break-even position until a similar program was started less than 5 km away (8 minute drive) by another Skate Canada Manitoba club that is not part of the Winnipeg region but is operating their program within Winnipeg region boundaries. This year SKW made the decision to completely drop the Sunday program in this location and all ice was returned to the City.

Top 3 successes in Winnipeg Region for the year:

- 1. Increased Number of CanSkaters transitioning to the STARSkate program in both clubs. Our coaches and members are volunteering lots of time to see this happen.
- 2. CSC: Building our club- many skaters are adding on days or times; many groups of skaters participating in STARSkate group lessons.
- 3. SKW: Implementing value added off-ice programing to enhance our STARSkate and Competitive Skater experience and keep in step with Skate Canada directives for conditioning and development. In the summer we added off-ice choreography to the summer program as an optional add-on. In the fall, a jump class and nutrition session were offered to intermediate and senior level skaters. For Junior level skaters, the new off-ice session was included in the Sunday Junior session. The off-ice session did an amazing job of teaching skaters and parents what they need to know to be successful in their chosen sport of figure skating, and how to have this sport for life.
- 4. SKW: Added two new on ice sessions this fall/winter, which alleviated some of the wait lists for our other sessions and opened up space for the new skaters transitioning from CanSkate to STARSkate. An open session on Wednesday Evenings at Sargent Park, and a Junior session at Dakota CC on Sunday afternoons.
