The 2020-2025 plan laid out required goals to achieve, and it is difficult to meet specific numbers when there are so many factors that influence and impact people. For example as part of our Grow the Membership priority, we aimed to increase coaches by 25%. In 2020 we had 123 coaches and by 2025 we have 140. According to the strategic plan we did not achieve our metrics, but this is a success and should be celebrated. This is addressed in the 2025-2029 plan where we have moved away from defining success by achieving quantitative numbers and now have varying types of progress indicators. The completion of the 2025-2029 plan took just over 6 months to complete! From stakeholder engagement, in person & virtual sessions and small group meetings, the plan was a labor of love and we are so excited to be starting the work to meet our priorities. Overview:

The Coaches Committee is an operational committee that provides recommended direction, oversight, and assistance to Skate Manitoba on coaching in our section. Committee activities include developing and delivering opportunities for engagement and education, advocating for Manitoba Skate Canada Professional Coaches at board meetings (Section Coaches Representative), providing recommendations and/or strategies to increase retention, engagement, and strength of coaches in Manitoba.

2024-25 Initiatives:

Coaches AGM:

We had 36 coaches attend our 2024 Coaches AGM in Brandon. The evening included supper, a social hour, opportunity to meet the board, section staff, committee chairs, and learning facilitators, and presentations on governance and coaching pathways, the 2024-25 competition calendar, Team Manitoba and Team TOBA, Power Skating.

Coach Development Series:

Manitoba coaches had the opportunity to learn from National Certified coaches in the singles and synchro disciplines this season. Three virtual sessions were held with Kevin Dawe focusing on skating skills, jumps, and spins. One virtual session was held with Marilyn Langlois focusing on synchro. Coaches were able to learn drills, error detection, and corrective exercises to incorporate into their coaching practice.

Mentorship:

Our committee developed the Skate Manitoba Coach Mentorship Program this season to foster the development and retention of coaches in our section by developing a sense of community and providing an opportunity for experienced coaches to share their knowledge. Coach Mentorship connects new coaches with an experienced mentor coach who can answer questions and provide guidance as they start their coaching career and aim to meet coaching goals. It's also an opportunity for experienced coaches, who are looking to expand their knowledge in a program or discipline, to connect with a mentor coach who has experience in that program or discipline.

Coaches Week:

We took the opportunity during National Coaches Week to celebrate and acknowledge the many contributions our coaches make to their skaters, clubs, and communities on our Skate Canada Manitoba Facebook page. We were fortunate to receive many wonderful prize donations to give away to coaches through draws.

Coaches Clothing:

Skate Manitoba Coach-branded clothing was available again this season for coaches to purchase.

Looking forward to 2025-26:

Our committee is excited to offer initiatives to improve and enhance Skate Manitoba coaching recruitment, retention, professional development, and experience in the 2025-26 year. We will be offering Skate Manitoba Coach cards for coaches to track their attendance at professional development opportunities and be entered to win prizes at next year's Coaches AGM. Below are some of the upcoming events and initiatives to look forward to.

Coaches AGM:

The 2025 Coaches AGM is scheduled for May 4th in Winnipeg and will include brunch. Education topics include neurodiversity in sport and a mock panel.

Coach Recognition:

We are looking to recognize new coaches, and coaches who are furthering their professional development at our Coaches AGM. We ask that Manitoba coaches who have attended the CanSkate, PowerSkate, or Regional NCCP courses and coaches who have obtained their Provincial or National certification this season to self-identify on the Coaches AGM registration. Our goal is to improve recruitment and retention of coaches in our section by welcoming new coaches into our coaching community, where they can find support and resources to complete their certifications, and celebrating coaches who have committed to professional development and completed certification at the Provincial and National level.

Coach Development Series:

We plan to offer the opportunity to learn from National Certified coaches again this season with a focus on Pairs and Dance disciplines. These education sessions will be offered virtually in the summer/fall 2025.

Mentorship:

The Skate Manitoba Coach Mentorship Program will run again this season and we will be accepting applications for mentee coaches and contacting mentor coaches in the upcoming months.

Mental Wellness for Coaches:

A free virtual session will be held for coaches this fall to help coaches recognize the signs of good, declining, and poor mental health in themselves and others, cultivate a safe, supportive environment where mental health can be discussed openly and without judgement or stigma, and improve individual resilience through practicing coping strategies in times of stress to prevent burnout.

Coaches Week:

Stay tuned for chances to celebrate our Skate Manitoba coaches September 15th to 21st during National Coaches Week!

Remarks:

A huge thank you to our committee members, who all volunteer their time throughout the year to plan, organize, and put our initiatives into action. Our committee would also like to acknowledge the support we receive from our section staff in the strategizing, planning, and promoting of our events and programming. Feedback from coaches is important to our committee and we encourage coaches to send us comments, questions, and ideas to help guide initiatives. Skate Manitoba continues to work on offering value at all its events. We continue to listen to feedback and this year have noted many areas where we can make improvements. The dates for the entire season should be available by end of May 2025.

Special thanks goes out to the LOC committee chairs who took on extra roles that made all the difference to the event and our volunteers.

12 Skaters earned their way onto **Team MANITOBA**. Programming started in May 2024 with our Virtual sessions. These included Sport Psych with Nicole Kuzmich, Program Components with Karen Howard, Nutrition with Jorie Janzen, Jump Theory and Jump classes with Kevin Dawe

Team TOBA had 26 Skaters qualify and join. Their programming began in August with Virtual sessions.

Both Teams were provided with an in-person meaningful experience opportunity that took place in Winnipeg during the Skate Canada Junior and Senior Challenge. They had different speakers, a back of house tour and a chance to watch Skaters in Singles, Pairs and Dance compete to earn a spot onto Canadians.

It was a big highlight to cheer on our Manitoba skaters!

Both teams have been well supported. Excellent feed back was received with a year end survey that went out to all skaters and their coaches. I have already started to implement some of the feedback into next season.

We will continue with the Virtual education sessions as they were incredibly valuable, successful and appreciated.

For Team Manitoba we are offering financial assistance to any skaters that chooses to compete at an out of Province (excluding MB and SK) with a reimbursement up to \$300.00 for their competition registration fee. The purpose is to encourage more skaters to gain more experience competing in other Provinces with other skaters at their level.

Manitoba Games is happening at the end of next season in March 2026, we have already done several info sessions for skaters, parents and coaches. A skater intent form came out in February, with a deadline in October. We already have 33 skaters signed up at this point.

With getting this information out early we have created interest with several up coming opportunities for the registered Manitoba Games participants. These include lesson opportunity at the Spring Development seminar, training days in May, June and November, a summer simulation chance and an education session with an Official at our September Simulations.

We also have a Coach registration for all coaches interested in coaching a Region Team at the Manitoba Games. We will be working with and supporting these coaches with continued education opportunities. Canada Winter Games is less than 2 years out, happening March 2027. Competition registration reimbursement support is also being offered to all skaters currently at the Pre Novice and Novice level and age eligible. We will continue to plan and offer opportunities this year and next for this group of skaters.

With the next Strat plan goals, we will be offering more LTD (Long Term Development) education opportunities to skaters, coaches and parents. We all need to better understand the benchmarks that Skate Canada has in place and plan accordingly.

Now that I have been in this position for more than a year, I feel I am reaching more skaters, coaches and parents. I am excited about all the initiatives that are being planned, and I will remain focused and dedicated to continual improvements.

I am so appreciative to the committee chairs and their committees I get to work with. Pam Parker, Amy Jackson and Michelle Janz are amazing leads who are dedicating their time and expertise to provide all our skaters' additional opportunities. I am also grateful for the work Jason Graetz does for our organization. Knowing he is a problem solver and amazing at what he does is such an advantage for everyone involved.

It continues to astound me just how much happens on any given day in the office. I am in awe of not only the amount of work that gets done, but the passion that is invested into the decisions that makes skating better in our Province. I know for a fact that I can do the work I am given due to the leadership and direction I receive from our Executive director Rosalyn Bauer. Rosalyn guides, directs and connects all of us. Her relationships with Skate Canada, Sport Manitoba, Skate Manitoba Chair, Executive and Board of Directors have set such a strong foundation for all of us to keep moving forward.

In closing, I would like to express how proud I am to be working with and for Skate Manitoba.

As a committee, we commit to offering fun and engaging sessions for our Learn to Train + Skate for Life athletes. We do our best to constantly push ourselves within our financial limits to offer fun ideas, bring in new clinicians as well as looking within our province and utilize the wealth of knowledge at home as well.

Meetings held for the 2023-24 season:

June 11, July 2, August 6, September 3, October 1 + 29, December 3, January 7, February 4, April 8.

Programming held in the 2023-24 season:

Jeff Buttle Seminar

Three day seminar for skaters, one day for Train to Train, one day for STAR 1-5, and one day for adult skates. We had two on-ice clinicians for Star + Adult [Jeff Buttle + Nicole Burt]. Weekend was a success, we had 26 skaters + 9 coaches on Friday [TTT], 72 LTT skaters + 19 coaches on Saturday [LTT] as well as 16 adult skaters on Sunday. We offered off-ice sessions such as Dare to Care programming, dance, a virtual off-ice spin class + nutrition throughout the three days. Overall our off-ice programming was well received, unfortunately the virtual session was hard to hear and therefore hard for the skaters to follow and keep engaged. We were thrilled to see social media coverage on the Skate MB stories throughout the three days, however were disappointed that only the Train to Train session was featured on social posts.

Synchro Monitoring

Five teams registered for our Annual Synchro Monitoring in Portage. Unfortunately, due to winter weather, only one of five teams were able to participate in person. Karen Ballinger and Amanda Jassman provided feedback to the team who attended, along with virtual feedback from videos provided by the other 4 teams. Portage arena only charged for the ice used, which was very generous.

Adult Virtual Sessions

We had Meagan Duhamel run two virtual off-ice sessions. We had low registrations of 4 for session one, and 5 for session two. We will not be continuing with these sessions next season.

STAR Seminar

We offered two STAR seminars this past season, one in the east [Morris] and one in the west [Rivers]. We had Patti Hole as our on-ice clinician. She also brought with her Team TOBA members Ainslee McGregor and Nate Greenbank. The Train to Train Committee plans and delivers development and training opportunities for figure skaters participating in the Performance Pathway in Manitoba, ensuring opportunities align with Skate Canada's Long Term Development and the Strategic Plan.

Train to Train Committee's Initiatives 2024-2025

1. Simulations:

Location: Portage La Prairie, MB
Date: September 14 & 15, 2024
Overview:
32 athletes registered from the Star 6 to Junior levels

We brought in 1 out-of-province official and 1 Technical Specialist to offer feedback and insight on skaters' elements and programs.

The event was a success, providing skaters with ample time and interaction with officials allowing them to receive in valuable feedback to support their development.

Robyn Forsyth led a bonus session for skaters on Sunday on "Maximizing their Points" for the upcoming season.

One highlight of the Simulation event was that registration nearly doubled in comparison to the previous year, reflecting significant growth and increased interest.

2. Virtual Training

Location: Online
Date: August – February, 2024
Overview:
Conducted eight Virtual Training Sessions catering to Star 6 - Gold level skaters.

Sessions offered included Jump Theory, Nutrition, a session by Karen Howard on understanding the interruption rule, Sport Psychology and Dance.

Skaters had the option of signing up for 4 Sport Science Sessions, 4 Dance Sessions or all 8 at a discounted rate

The sessions were very informative but registration and attendance low and some communication mishaps and rescheduling of a couple of sessions we have decided to move away from this programming in our next budget.

3. Come Skate With Us Fall Seminar

Location: Portage La Prairie, MB

Date: October 25, 2024

Overview:

Together with the Learn to Train Committee, we organized a one-day skater development seminar with clinician Jeffrey Buttle, focusing on skating skills and performance as the main goals of the seminar.

On-Ice sessions focused on body movement while skating, creative movement, skating skills, jump preparation exercises, jumps and spins

Off ice sessions included on Flexibility led by Veronica Gould, Nutrition led by Jorrie Janzen and Anti-bullying led by the Dare to Care organization.

We had 27 skaters, and 14 coaches attend.

Upcoming Initiatives 2024-2025:

Spring Training Seminar:

Location: April 13-14, 2024 – Morden, MB.

We hosted a 2-day seminar for Pre-Juvenile to Senior and Star 5-Gold athletes. The purpose of our Spring Training Seminar was to facilitate the development of new skills and techniques in accordance with the appropriate timing for the athletes' yearly training plan.

Jen Jackson from the Hamilton Skating Club was our clinician, and she was accompanied by Novice Ladies competitor Quinn Starkel was the demonstrator.

Jen and Quinn led the on-ice sessions which included exercises to improve jump, spin and basic skating technique.

The off-ice sessions included Yebin Mok focusing on skating skills, posture, extensions, and dance articulation; Deidre Shrek leading skipping and spinner exercises; Brooklyn Parker guiding flexibility and mobility training; and Kailey Thiessen teaching ballet, all contributing to the well-rounded development of the skaters.

Skaters who had declared their intent to compete in the Manitoba Winter Games, Canada Games eligible athletes and Team Manitoba members who had registered for both days of the seminar were given the opportunity to work one on one or in small groups with the clinician for extra individual support.

42 skaters and 18 coaches attended the seminar over the 2 days which was an increase from last year

This seminar was well received by skaters and coaches. Having the same clinician for the second year proved invaluable, as it reinforced consistency in the exercises. The off-ice sessions were aligned with the on-ice training messages, creating a cohesive development experience for the skaters.

Summer Simulations:

Location: – July 18, 2025 - Seven Oaks Arena, Winnipeg, MB

This new initiative aims to provide skaters with an invaluable performance opportunity early in the season, giving them a head start as they prepare for the competitive year ahead. The initiative also includes a dedicated training session for Manitoba Winter Games athletes, providing them with essential ice time during months when their clubs may not be offering programs.
