The Skate Manitoba Junior Senior Sectional Championships + Fall Open welcomes skaters to compete in this event. Sectionals provides the opportunity for Junior and Senior skaters to seek qualification to the 2025-2026 Skate Canada Challenge.

Each Sectionals event is the property of Skate Canada. The planning and execution of each Sectional Championship is delegated to the Section and/or its host committee with support from Skate Canada nationally, and the event is under the technical supervision of a technical representative assigned by the Section.

The 2025 Skate Manitoba Junior Senior Sectionals + Fall Open will be conducted in accordance with the <u>Skate Canada Rule Book</u>. Discipline specific pre-event technical packages, ISU Communications and clarifications should also be referred to in preparation for the upcoming season.

All events are open to skaters from all Sections. Please note skaters registered for Junior or Senior Singles, who are not from Manitoba, will have a separate ceremony for the event.

Eligibility to Participate

For all Skate Canada rules pertaining to eligibility to participate, please see the Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Competitions, Section 2; Eligibility to Participate</u>.

Qualifications for Entry

Age Requirements; Please see the Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Competitions, Section 5; Age</u> <u>Requirements for Qualifying Competition Categories.</u>

Assessment Requirements; Please see the Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Competitions, Section 6;</u> <u>Assessment Requirements for Qualifying Competition Categories</u>.

Competing in Singles at Sectionals; A Skater may compete in Singles events only in the Championships of the Section in which their home club/school is a member.

Competing in Pairs or Dance at Sectionals; All Pre-Novice through Senior Pairs and Dance teams must register and compete at the Skate Saskatchewan Sectional Championships to be eligible for Challenge.

Please see the <u>Competition Program Requirements</u> for the current technical requirements information.

Entry Information

Registration must be submitted online at <u>Skate Manitoba Uplifter Registration platform</u>. Registrations will be accepted until **Wednesday**, *September 24*, *2025* at 11:45 pm. (CST).

For technical difficulties with registration on Uplifter, please contact Jason Graetz via email at <u>skate.admin@sportmanitoba.ca</u>. When emailing, please include a clear screen shot of the error or difficulty. Email communication is preferred.

Skaters are strongly encouraged to register well ahead of the deadline so if assistance is required, there will be time to resolve the issue prior to the close of registration.

No registrations will be accepted after 11:45 pm. (CST) on Wednesday, September 24, 2025.

NOTE: Planned Program information MUST be submitted at the time of registration, including music. <u>There will be ONE PPC form per freeskate program entry</u>. Please ensure that you complete otherwise you will not be able to finalize your registration.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given up to and including the registration deadline however, they will be subject to a \$50 administrative and online processing fees. No Refunds will be given after the closing date of entries of the competition. NO medical refunds at any time after the close of entries (registration deadline).

Events to be Held

- All events are subject to the availability of officials.
- An Officials Development fee of \$3.00 per event will be added to each event registration at the time of payment.
- A Technology fee of \$5.00 per skater will be added to each registration at the time of payment.
- Skaters wishing to participate in supplemental Fall Open events may do so. It is \$55.00 per additional event.
- Planned program and music must be uploaded at the time of registration

Onsite Registration

Registration for skaters, officials and coaches will commence prior to the first practice. Skaters must register no later than one hour prior to the beginning of their event. Registration will take place at the main entrance of the Access Event Centre.

Planned Program Content Forms <u>must be submitted</u> at the time of on-line registration only. Planned Program Content Forms will not be accepted at the competition.

Music will NOT be submitted at the registration desk. Please see the 'Music' section below for more information about back up music.

On Site Registration & Practice Ice

Practice rotations will be available at registration and will be sent out in advance. Practice ice is only available to Junior and Senior Sectionals Competitors.

<u>REGISTRATION</u>: Unless otherwise listed in the event announcement competitors must register for the competition before their official practice session immediately prior to the first portion of their event.

Skate Canada Coach Information

A maximum of two coaches per entry will be accredited. A maximum of two people will be allowed at ice level – determined by the skater/team.

It is the responsibility of the coach(es) to ensure that they meet the requirements to be able to attend a competition with their athlete. <u>Please click here</u> for important information surrounding certification requirements, requesting special permission, and accreditation at the event. If you have received special permission for your certification level in a previous season to attend a qualifying event, you will <u>not</u> be granted permission again.

Judging System

The Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System will be used for all events. For more information about CPC please see Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Scoring of Skate Canada Competitions</u>.

Draws

The starting order of the competitors for each Event will be randomly drawn by the Data Specialist in cooperation with the Technical Representative. The draw may be done manually or by computer. See Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Competitions, Section 3; Conduct of an Event.</u>

Draw for Subsequent Starting Orders for the Event

Competitors will be assigned to skate the second Segment in reverse order of the results from the first Segment.

Music

All music used must be legally obtained and covered by the collective societies who manage music performance rights, reprography, and mechanical reproduction rights in Canada. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, that has been significantly mixed or altered from the original recording, are also responsible for obtaining the appropriate licenses to create a derivative work for the compositions and sound recordings selected.

Music Requirements:

Music must be received at time of registration in MP3 format by the registration deadline. There will be an upload section on the online PPC form you will complete.

The music downloaded must include the skater's full name and the event in which they are registered to skate. Example: M Mouse/Senior/Free Program

NEW: Competitors will <u>NOT</u> hand in their back up music at the time of registration. Skaters will hold onto their music and keep it on their persons, or with their board side accredited coach. In the event that the back up music is required by the Audio Technician, the skater or coach will deliver the music to the Audio Technician.

The back up music must be on a USB memory stick. CD's will NOT be accepted. A memory stick may contain multiple programs however, it must be properly labeled.

No alternate electronic items such as iPhone, tablets, MP3 players etc. will be accepted.

Awards

Medals will be presented to the top three finishers of each event. In the case of only two entries, each entry shall be awarded a medal. In the case of a Single Event entry the participant will be awarded a Participation medal. Provincial Championship medals will be awarded to the top finisher of the Junior and Senior Events. The presentation schedule will be available at registration.

Accidents/Liability

Skate Manitoba Section, Skate Canada and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, the Skate Canada, the volunteer team and against their officers and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

Medical Services & Injury Reporting

Medical Services available to skaters will be in a designated area on-site. Ice level first aid personnel will be available for the duration of practice and competition.

Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted while athletes are on the ice during practice or competition. Skate Manitoba restricts the use of cameras and video equipment during Skate Canada Sanctioned events out of respect for the safety and to protect the privacy of competing athletes.

<u>Coaches</u> are only permitted to video tape their own skater from the boards during that skater's practice or performance.
