The Skate Manitoba Winter Blast Competition is an open event that welcomes skaters to Pilot Mound, Manitoba to compete in a fun filled weekend for participants from STAR 1 through Gold & Adult.

Skate Manitoba will do its best to keep events of the same level on the same day of competition.

Several Athlete room blocks have been arranged by the host committee in nearby towns. Please see Accommodations section for information on how to access/book.

Concession (cash/card) is available in the rink (hotdogs, hamburgers, fries, popcorn chicken, onion rings, soup, chips, drinks, chocolate bars, etc). There are two restaurants in town (Haw's & Call-Inn's) plus one close by (Crystal City Bistro) plus grab-n-go wraps/salads available from Mound Foods grocery store. Special Olympics Documents – Please see <u>Skate Canada Special Olympic Documents</u> for information on technical requirements. Please note athletes MUST be a registered member of Special Olympics Manitoba.

Please note that STAR 5-Gold & Adult Free skate, Artistic, and Synchro (STAR 4+) entries must submit a completed Planned Program sheet as part of their registration.

Please be sure to complete the form as part of the registration. The registration cannot be submitted for any the events listed above if the PPC is not completed.

Entry Information

Entry forms must be submitted online at <u>Skate Manitoba Uplifter Registration platform</u>. Registrations will be accepted until **Tuesday**, *January 13*, *2026* at 11:45 pm. (CST).

For technical difficulties with registration on Uplifter, please contact the Section Office via email at skate.admin@sportmanitoba.ca. When emailing, please include a clear screen shot of the error or difficulty. Email communication is preferred.

Skaters are strongly encouraged to register well ahead of the deadline so if assistance is required, there will be time to resolve the issue prior to the close of registration.

No registrations will be accepted after 11:45 pm (CST) on Tuesday, January 13, 2026.

NOTE: Planned Program information MUST be submitted at the time of registration, including music, if applicable for your event.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given up to and including the registration deadline however, they will be subject to a \$50 administrative and online processing fees. No Refunds will be given after the closing date of entries of the competition. NO medical refunds at any time after the close of entries (registration deadline).

- An Officials Development fee of \$3.00 and a Technology fee of \$5.00 has been included in the registration fee.

- Planned program and music must be uploaded at the time of registration.

Onsite Registration

Skaters/teams are expected to register no later than 1 hour before their event (no earlier than 45 minutes if first event of the day). Planned Program Content Forms <u>must be submitted</u> at the time of online registration only. Planned Program Content Forms will not be accepted at the competition.

Music will NOT be submitted at the registration desk. Please see the 'Music' section below for more information about back up music.

Skate Canada Coach Information

A maximum of two coaches per entry will be accredited. A maximum of two people will be allowed at ice level – determined by the skater/team.

It is the responsibility of the coach(es) to ensure that they meet the requirements to be able to attend a competition with their athlete. <u>Please click here</u> for important information surrounding certification requirements, requesting special permission, and accreditation at the event.

Coaches who have an athlete participating in a Special Olympics Event MUST be registered with Special Olympics Manitoba to be able to be with the athlete at the boards.

Judging System & Awards

STAR 1-4 categories, including Synchro, are assessed to standard. Skaters in STAR 1-3 will receive a ribbon and a report card corresponding to their achievement. STAR 4 skaters/teams, will be ranked and skaters/teams placing 1^{st} , 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} will receive Skate Manitoba medals. All skaters will receive a report card showing individual element assessment.

The Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System will be used for all other events (STAR 5 and up, Artistic, Adult, etc...). For more information about CPC please see Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Scoring of Skate Canada Competitions</u>.

Skate Manitoba medals will be presented to the top three finishers of each CPC event. In the case of only two entries, each entry shall be awarded a medal. In the case of a Single Event entry the participant will be awarded a Participation medal. The presentation schedule will be available at registration.

Event Composition

Events will be divided into flights according to age groups specified by qualification. Age will be used in dividing flights. There will be no final events. Flights will be kept under 10 skaters per flight where possible. Skating order will be drawn at random, see Competitions, Section 3; Conduct of an Event..

It is permissible to combine events as follows:

- Combine two or more categories in the same event when each category has fewer than three entries;
- Combine two or more categories in the same event when one category has insufficient entries to hold the event.

The decision to combine events is at the discretion of the Tech Rep and/or Chief Referee.

Synchro teams will skate once.

Music

All music used must be legally obtained and covered by the collective societies who manage music performance rights, reprography, and mechanical reproduction rights in Canada. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, that has been significantly mixed or altered from the original recording, are also responsible for obtaining the appropriate licenses to create a derivative work for the compositions and sound recordings selected.

For Ice Dance Pattern event warm ups, where there are more than one entry, the Skate Canada dance music shall be played.

Music Requirements:

Music must be received at time of registration in MP3 format by the registration deadline. There will be an upload section on the PPC you will complete.

The music downloaded must include the skater's full name and the event in which they are registered to skate. Example: M Mouse/Senior/Free Program

NEW: Competitors will <u>NOT</u> hand in their back up music at the time of registration. Skaters will hold onto their music and keep it on their persons, or with their board side accredited coach. In the event that the back up music is required by the Audio Technician, the skater or coach will deliver the music to the Audio Technician.

The back up music must be on a USB memory stick. <u>CD's will NOT be accepted</u>. A memory stick may contain multiple programs however, it must be properly labeled.

No alternate electronic items such as iPhone, tablets, MP3 players etc. will be accepted.

Accidents/Liability

Skate Manitoba Section, Skate Canada and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, the Skate Canada, the volunteer team and against their officers and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

Medical Services & Injury Reporting

Medical Services available to skaters will be in a designated area on-site. Ice level first aid personnel will be available for the duration of practice and competition.

Camera Policy

For the safety of our athletes, please note that flash photography is not permitted.

Any electronic devices with audio and/or video recording capabilities are prohibited from being used while in dressing/changing rooms.
